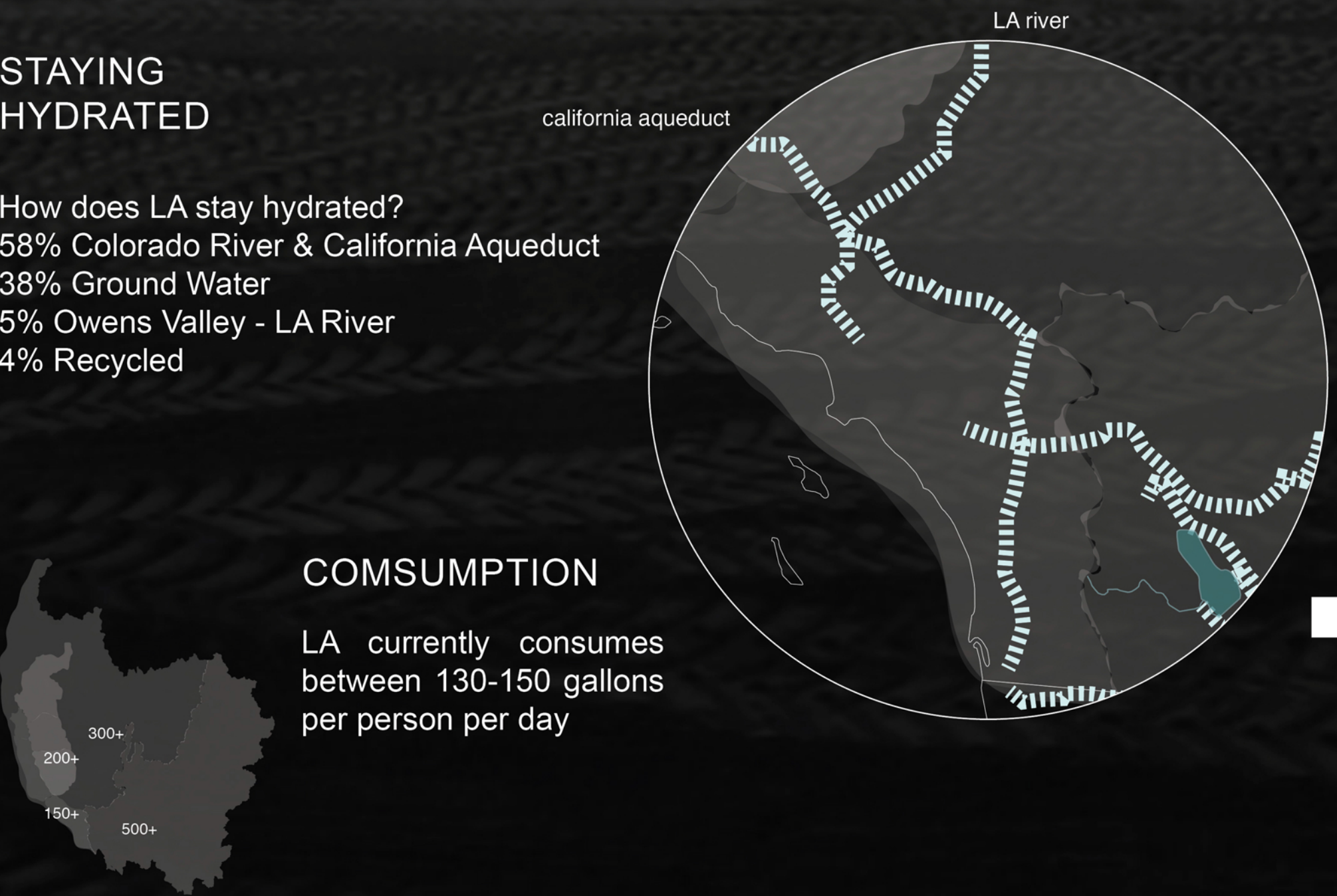
DEHYDRATED WATER SYSTEMS
